The wards need to reflect the Parish Council Boundaries and also the Parliamentary constituencies that have recently been agreed upon, and as such not overlap in any way. It would be far too confusing for all. It's already now confusing/creates controversy having parliamentary wards that cross over with two different councils (ERYC and Hull CC).

Swanland and North Ferriby are effectively one community albeit separate villages with lots of cross over between the two given the close location and that to get to Swanland from various routes you have to drive through Ferriby to get there. Melton and Welton, and Wauldby, then dovetail very nicely into here with little separation from Swanland and Ferriby with Melton, they also share the same senior school. As such these villages need to be part of the same Ward and based on population the correct balance already exists. If you were to expand this Ward the only option, seeing as there's no possible expansion to the East, as this takes you into a different Parliamentary area, or south, would be to add in the villages of Raywell, Skidby and Eppleworth. However these are very different communities to the current South Hunsley Ward.

To add Brough with the villages in South Hunsley Ward would be adding in what is now a town and as such probably inappropriate given the geography and very different nature of the villages compared to the town.

You probably need to separate the town of Brough/Elloughton from the rest of Dale Ward due to the very different nature of the settlements.
