


Our Recommendations

Who we are

- The Local Government Boundary Commission for England is an independent body set up by Parliament.
- We are not part of government or any political party.
- We are accountable to Parliament through a committee of MPs chaired by the Speaker of the House of Commons.
- Our main role is to carry out electoral reviews of local authorities throughout England.

Electoral review

An electoral review examines and proposes new electoral arrangements for a local authority, including:

- The total number of councillors representing the council's electors ('council size').
- The names, number and boundaries of wards or electoral divisions.
- The number of councillors for each ward or division.

Why Cheshire East?

- Cheshire East Council currently has high levels of electoral inequality: some councillors represent many more - or many fewer - electors than others.
- We are seeking to improve levels of electoral equality for local electors

Our proposals

- Cheshire East Council currently has 82 councillors. Based on the evidence we received, we recommend that 82 councillors should continue to serve the council in the future.
- We believe our final recommendations meet our statutory criteria to:
 1. Deliver electoral equality for electors
 2. Reflect community interests and identities
 3. Promote effective and convenient local government

Summary of our recommendations

We have considered all the submissions we received during our consultation on our draft recommendations.

The final recommendations propose that Cheshire East should have 82 councillors, the same as there are now.

Cheshire East should have 47 wards, a decrease of 5. The boundaries of most of the existing wards should change.

The 82 councillors should represent 7 three-councillor wards, 21 two-councillor wards and 19 single-councillor wards across the authority.

23 January - 1 April 2024	Public consultation on warding arrangements
1 October - 9 December 2024	Public consultation on draft recommendations
13 May 2025	Publication of final recommendations
May 2027	Subject to parliamentary approval - implementation of new arrangements at local elections
