The Local Government Boundary Commission for England is the independent body responsible for determining the electoral arrangements of local authorities across England. I am writing to you to inform you that the Commission has decided to undertake an electoral review of York City Council.

The purpose of an electoral review is to consider the number of councillors elected to the council, the names, number and boundaries of the wards, and the number of councillors to be elected to each ward.

The Local Democracy, Economic Development and Construction Act 2009 sets out the duty placed on the Commission to undertake an electoral review of every principal local authority in England 'from time to time'. Accordingly, the Commission considers that a review of your authority should take place in time to be implemented at your election in 2027. I am writing to a number of other authorities on a similar basis.

#### The electoral review process:

The first decision the Commission will take is how many councillors you will have. We will invite the Council (and groups on the council) to make proposals for how many members you believe there should be in in the future. There is <u>guidance and a template</u> on our website that will support you through this process.

Once the Commission decides on the total number of councillors, we will then move to the warding pattern part of the process which starts with a full public consultation where we ask the Council as well as the wider electorate, including community groups, parish/town councils and members of the public think the ward boundaries should be.

We will then publish our draft recommendations which we then consult on again.

The publication of our final recommendations marks the end of the review process. We will then lay an Order in Parliament. The new electoral arrangements will be implemented at an 'all out' election on the ordinary day of elections in 2027.

### The role of the authority under review

In advance of the first public consultation, there will be a preliminary period of around six months during which the Commission will gather information from the Council. We will also brief your members and officers on the detail of the review process.

There are three main areas of work for the Council:

- 1. Preparing electorate forecasts, mapping and details of your housing developments. We will expect you to prepare five-year electorate forecasts broken down to polling district level. This reflects the statutory duty to consider forecasts five years from the end of the review.
- 2. Preparing and submitting a warding pattern during the first public consultation and responding to our draft recommendations
- 3. Supporting us in publicising the review including by sharing details of interested parties and supporting meetings with community and residents' groups.

I look forward to working with you.
