Final Recommendations on the new electoral arrangements



Who we are

- The Local Government Boundary Commission for England is an independent body set up by Parliament.
- We are not part of government or any political party.
- We are accountable to Parliament through a committee of MPs chaired by the Speaker of the House of Commons.
- Our main role is to carry out electoral reviews of local authorities throughout England.

Electoral review

An electoral review examines and proposes new electoral arrangements for a local authority, including:

- The total number of councillors representing the council's electors ('council size').
- The names, number and boundaries of divisions or electoral divisions.
- The number of councillors for each division or division.

Why North Yorkshire?

- The Commission is carrying out an electoral review of North Yorkshire as it is a new local authority.

Our proposals

- North Yorkshire Council currently has 90 councillors. Based on the evidence we received, we recommend that 89 councillors should serve the council in the future.
- We believe our final recommendations meet our statutory criteria to:
  1. Deliver electoral equality for electors
  2. Reflect community interests and identities
  3. Promote effective and convenient local government

Summary of our recommendations

We have considered all the submissions we received during our consultation on our draft recommendations.

The final recommendations propose that North Yorkshire should have 89 councillors, a decrease of one.

North Yorkshire should have 87 divisions, a decrease of 2. The boundaries of most of the existing divisions should change.

The 89 councillors should represent 2 two-councillor divisions and 85 single-councillor divisions across the authority.

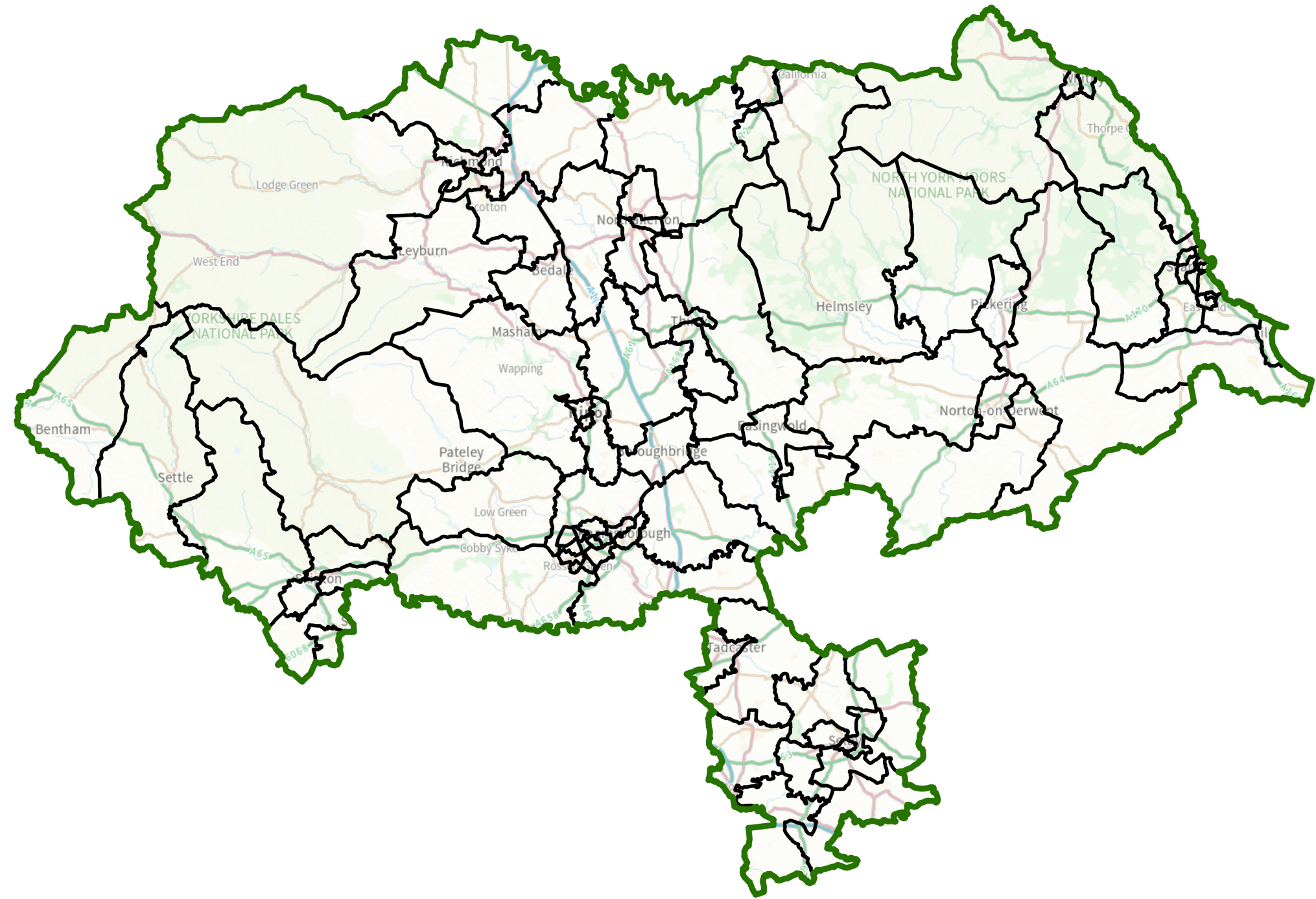

Stage of Review	Description
1 October - 9 December 2024	Public consultation on division arrangements
1 April - 9 June 2025	Public consultation on draft recommendations
2 September - 13 October 2025	Public consultation on revised proposals
14 January 2026	Publication of final recommendations
May 2027	Subject to parliamentary approval - implementation of new arrangements at local elections
